## Old School History Museum



The Old School History Museum is housed in four classrooms of the original 1916 Eatonton School, now the home of the Plaza Arts Center. Visitors will experience the following:



A vintage drugstore complete with marble-topped soda fountain, 1940's jukebox, ice cream chairs and tables and period photographs.

A reproduction of the turn-ofthe-century downtown Eatonton with a variety of storefronts. These "windows in time" feature artifacts and treasures destined to stir childhood memories.





A history gallery that guides visitors through early Indian culture, the transition of frontier land to prosperous cotton farms, the impact of the Civil War and Reconstruction, and into the 20th Century.

A historic classroom restored to its early 1900's condition. The classroom boasts its original blackboard, cloakroom, vintage desks and a collection of student memorabilia.
